

INTERNATIONAL DIVER COURSE

MASL P179003 **Duration: 13 weeks**
ECL 80

Offered once per year in February

**Prerequisite: Dive medical physical
with special duty abstract**

The course provides basic and advanced training in surface-supplied air and scuba diving procedures. The course includes classroom theory, practical in-water diving and hands on supervisory training including rigorous physical and in-water training exercises. Instruction includes:

- diving equipment operations and procedures
- diving physics and medicine
- basic ship construction
- principles of salvage operations
- diving supervisor training
- recompression chamber
- diving casualty control operations
- mixed gas diving theory and operations

A critical component of the course is daily physical training involving calisthenics, running, and swimming as well as basic water survival techniques.



DIVER EXPLOSIVE ORDNANCE DISPOSAL

MASL P179190 **Duration: App. 45 days**
ECL 80

Offered 8 times per year

Prerequisite: Dive medical physical

Course provides training necessary to safely perform as a dive team member for scuba and MK 16 diving operations. Course includes diving physics, identifying diving injuries, and recognizing the need for treatment.

Specific ordnance training may be available at Naval School of EOD, Eglin AFB after course completion.



RECOGNITION AND TREATMENT OF DIVING CASUALTIES

MASL P175002 **Duration: 2 weeks**
ECL 80

Offered 8 times per year

Prerequisite: Dive medical physical

The recognition and treatment of diving casualties course is designed to provide medical officers with the basic training necessary to safely and effectively perform as a medical advisor for hyperbaric treatments and to effectively evaluate divers and diver candidates prior to diving. Prepares medical officers in identifying diving diseases and injuries, and initiating the appropriate treatment, performing appropriate diving medical examinations, and performing in an inside tender for hyperbaric chamber operations.

MEDICAL DEPARTMENT DIVING OFFICER (DMO)

MASL P175503 **Duration: App. 45 days**
ECL 80

Offered 2 times per year

The course provides U.S. Navy Undersea Medical Officer Candidates (UMOC) with training in diving and dive medicine. Students become familiar or qualified with multiple diving systems used by U.S. military forces. Instruction includes hyperbaric physiology, surface supported deep sea diving systems, air, scuba and lightweight diving systems. Upon successful completion, candidates become qualified Navy divers.

Eligibility Requirements: This course is intended for physicians or physician assistants. Most U.S. Navy UMOCs are selected through the Navy Graduate Medical Education. The DMO course (P175503) is also available as an isolated course for qualified physicians from other branches of the military. Applicants must be physically qualified for diving duty per U.S. Navy standards, and must have a diving physical examination current to within 2 years of date of application. In addition, they must pass the Navy Diver Physical Screening Test. Physical training is mandatory and challenging. Students unable to keep up with physical training will be dropped from the course.



US NAVAL DIVING AND SALVAGE TRAINING CENTER

Naval Diving and Salvage Training Center trains all military divers with the exception of U.S. Navy Special Warfare (SEALS) and Special Forces. The training includes Navy, Army, Air Force, Coast Guard and all Marine Corps Combatant divers. Naval Diving and Salvage Training Center also provides training for a limited number of law enforcement and government agency personnel and allied forces.

The center teaches approximately 1300 students per year, with an average of 300 students in training at any given time. The Training Center conducts approximately ten thousand dives each year.



All students must pass the prerequisite physical screening test as found in MILPERSMAN 1220-100. This test will be administered the second day of training. Physical examination forms DD 2808 and DD 2807-1 should be forwarded to NAVDIVESALVTRACEN Medical Department 45 days before the class convening date for review. A point of contact name should accompany each physical.

Note: All international students should attend the BUD/S (Basic Underwater Demolition/ SEAL), Dive and Swim Preparatory Course (MASL PDET016) at NITC Pensacola, FL prior to all Navy dive courses. This prep course provides physical conditioning and swim training to ensure students are able to successfully meet the rigorous physical demands of their follow-on training.
