

FLAGSHIP INTERNATIONAL ONLY COURSES

International Senior Officer Amphibious Course MASL P171007

Duration: 10 weeks

The Senior Officer Amphibious course is designed to give officers a graduate level understanding of amphibious warfare and humanitarian. Additionally, Students will travel to Los Angeles, CA, Washington, DC, and Annapolis, MD to receive a broader look into US Culture. Students will receive Amphibious Warfare Indoctrination, Expeditionary Warfare Staff Planning, Humanitarian Aid and Disaster Relief, and executive education from Scholars from the Center for Civil Military-Relations. Students will have the opportunity to tour the local area in San Diego to include visiting a Congressional Office, The San Diego Jail, The Coronado Police Department, The San Diego Agricultural Center, and much more.

International Coalition Staff Planning MASL P171008

Duration: 5 weeks

International Coalition Staff Planning Course is designed to develop Junior Officers culturally and intellectually through unique experiences in the classroom and local area. The course provides a composite of AWI and EWSP to give students an understanding of the US Navy and Marine Corps command and communication structure. Students will receive a weeklong course each of Humanitarian Aid and Disaster relief in an international environment and a world class course taught by the Center for Civilian Military Relations from Naval Post Graduate School in Monterey, CA on International Command Structure and coordination in an expeditionary setting. Students will also experience US culture through visiting a congressman's office and tours of local facilities such as a police station, fire station, and prison.

EWTGPAC INTERNATIONAL COURSES

Amphibious Warfare Indoctrination (P124250) (1 week) Provides comprehensive indoctrination in amphibious techniques, planning, ship-to-shore movement, supporting arms, tactical air and landing force organization.

Expeditionary Warfare Staff Planning (P124251) (1 week), prerequisite is Amphibious Warfare Indoctrination. Trains officers and NCOs in the knowledge and skills required for the operational planning and employment of Marine Air-Ground Task Forces (MAGTFs).

Tactical Air Control Party (P124520) (5 weeks) Provides training in the joint tactics, techniques, and procedures used for controlling and integrating the broad spectrum of fire support and air power available to the MAGTF Commander or Joint Task Force (JTF) Commander. A three-day live fire exercise is included.

Landing Craft Air Cushion (LCAC) Craftmaster Crew (P124322) (20 weeks) Provides knowledge and skills required to operate the LCAC in normal, emergency, and degraded modes over water and land in all weather conditions.

Naval Gunfire Liaison Officer (P124265) (5 weeks) Provides training for officers & NCOs for duty as naval gunfire liaison personnel with Marine Corps divisions and other units.

Rapid Response Planning Process Staff Primer (P124004) (1 week) Designed to prepare deploying MEUs, PHIBRONs, and NSEs to function effectively and efficiently during the planning phase of amphibious operations.

Naval Surface Fire Support Training (MK34 Gun Weapon System) (P142006) (1 week) Provides training to a shipboard Naval Surface Fires Support Team in proper execution of Naval Surface Fires

Support (NSFS) to conduct safe and effective firing.

Supporting Arms Coordination Course (P122170) (2 week) Reviews the various supporting arms principles of fire support planning, role of intelligence, and targeting in fire support operations.

LCAC Mechanical Maintenance Course (P145555) (5 weeks) Provides information, skill development, and practical application to set up, check out, and maintain the LCAC gas turbine engines, propulsion, and mechanical auxiliaries.

LCAC Craft Control System Maintenance (P145556) (5 weeks) Provides orientation, skill development, and practical application to perform maintenance on LCAC electrical power distribution, main engine controls, fuel system, fire protection, and craft control systems.

Planning Joint Logistics Over-The-Shore OPS (P151001) (1 week) Provides training for officers & NCOs to conduct the detailed planning and execution of JLOTS operations.

Maritime Prepositioning Force Staff Planning (P124112) (1 week) Provides training in the doctrinal knowledge and skills required in the operational planning, deployment and employment of MAGTFs as part of the Maritime Prepositional Force (MPF).

Steps to Obtain International Training

- 1.** Contact Security Cooperation Office in US Embassy.
- 2.** Request course based on MASL number.
- 3.** If approved, International Student is screened by Security Cooperation Office for medical, English testing, and security screening.
- 4.** Invitational Travel Order is issued to the student.
- 5.** International Student arrives at command for training with Invitational Travel Order.
