AIR SICKNESS DESENSITIZE

Duration is self-paced (6-8 weeks)

Course is offered on request

A comprehensive treatment of last resort for airsickness in aircrew who have not adapted to the dis-equilibrating environment of flight. Self-Paced Airsickness Desensitization (SPAD) use of cross-coupled coriolis stimulation combined with extensive biofeedback techniques have enabled most aircrew with seemingly intractable airsickness to return to flying. Treatment typically takes from four to five weeks.

STRESS & ANGER MGMT

Course is offered 4 times per year

Provides students with the means of recognizing symptoms of stress and the ability to cope with it through relaxation techniques, diet and exercise, and, time management. Includes causes of anger, history, responses, ways to handle criticism and anger aggression vs. assertiveness, coping and self-esteem.

HOSPITALMAN SCHOOL BASIC

Course is offered multiple times per year

Teaches the basic principles and techniques of emergency medical care, operational medicine, and nursing care procedures. Prepares enlisted personnel for duties as a general service hospital corpsman to function with the fleet operating units, and/or medical treatment facilities, and preparation for further training.



SURFACE FORCE MEDICAL INDOCTRINATION

Duration is 1 week

Course is offered 11 times per year

Orients medical and dental enlisted personnel in the duties and responsibilities of assignments to components of a naval surface force.

Introduces the student to shipboard medical/dental administration; triage, treatment, and transportation of combat casualties; Authorized Medical & Dental Allowance (AMAL/ADAL) and inventories; shipboard sanitation and potable water testing; Heat Stress and Hearing Conservation Programs; and the Naval Shipboard Non-Tactical ADP Program (SNAP) Automated Medical System (SAMS).

SURFACE FORCE INDEPENDENT DUTY CORPSMAN

Course is offered 5 times per year

Prerequisite: Hospitalman Basic (P175504)

Provides training in advanced patient care, medical administration, and logistical duties, enabling a hospitalman or corpsman to function independently with forward deployed forces and isolated sea and shore activities.

COMMANDER AMPHIBIOUS TASK FORCE/EXPEDITIONARY STRIKE GROUP SURGEON

Duration is 2 weeks

Course is offered once per year

Prerequisite: Officer O-4 and above, preferably with operational experience

Provides experienced medical officers with the opportunity to develop the skills required for service as the senior medical advisor to an amphibious task force. Includes training in the design of an amphibious operation and its associated medical logistics, an overview of the medical aspects of operations other than war, and a current brief on geopolitical and medical intelligence. Graduates will be able to serve effectively as amphibious task force/expeditionary strike group surgeons.



Emergency War Surgery

Duration is 1 week

Course is offered once per year

This course describes the common patterns of battlefield injuries and familiarizes the student with their surgical management. It discusses a variety of battle damage control techniques, and defines the concept of forward resuscitative measures in the management of battlefield casualties and evacuation. Students will perform basic emergency ophthalmologic, orthopedic and neurosurgical procedures through "hands-on" instruction by surgical specialists in a cadaveric lab. The student will demonstrate expertise in performing an exploratory laparotomy for trauma through a variety of simulated injuries in the pig lab.

Additionally, the course demonstrates the principles of ultrasound techniques in combat trauma patients using didactics and simulation Lab. The student must demonstrate the ability to manage multiple battlefield casualties in a simulated mass casualty exercise.
