## Security Cooperation

Includes programs through which DoD provides materials, services, and training. Programs are conducted with allies and friendly nations, in order to:

- Improve information exchange and intelligence sharing
- Build defense relationships that support U.S. security
- Provide U.S. forces with needed military access
- Develop military capabilities for self-defense and coalition operations (includes training)

- Foreign Military Sales (FMS)
- Foreign Military Financing (FMF)
- International Military Education and Training (IMET)
- Combating Terrorism Fellowship Program (CTFP)

## Why We Do It

- Long-term benefit / influence by education and training future civilian and military leaders
- Only military engagement tool available in some countries
- Further goals of regional stability through military-to-military relations
- Augment capabilities of military forces to support combined operations and interoperability
- Increase ability of foreign military and civilian personnel to instill and maintain basic democratic values and protect internationally recognized human rights

## About NETSAFA

NETSAFA manages the Navy's international education and training programs. Over 7,000 military and civilian personnel from 150 nations attend education and training activities annually at various learning sites in the U.S., as well as courses conducted in the students' home nation.

## NETSAFA Role As NETC's Executive Agent For International Training

- Focal point for training requirements, planning, programming and scheduling
- Host and conduct DON IMSO Workshop
- Liaise with all NETC activities and centers and their designated IMSOs to provide guidance and respond to SCETP queries
- Coordinate disclosure and releasability of USN training and training materials
- Authorize issuance of Invitation Travel Orders
- Approve English Comprehension Level (ECL) and rank waivers for U.S. Navy training
- Ensure NETC activities have access to the Security Assistance Network in order to view international student projections, provide international student status reports, academic evaluations, and other required reports
- Coordinate U.S. Navy SCETP sponsored orientation visits to CONUS
- Course costing, MASL development, projections and reimbursements
- Focal point for all obsolete curriculum, training aids and equipment



## Supporting the IMSOs

The International Military Student Officer (IMSO) performs one of the most important jobs in the Security Cooperation Program. IMSOs provide administrative, logistical, medical, and personnel support for the International Military Students (IMS) at military installations.



NETSAFA supports IMSOs in several ways:

- Drafts, updates, and distributes the annual U.S. Navy IMSO Guide, which provides the policy and guidance necessary for the IMSOs
- Updates Navy Section of Joint Security Cooperation Education and Training Regulation (JSCET): SECNAVINST 4950
- Drafts and distributes IMSO Bulletins whenever IMSOs should be notified of important or time-critical information
- Interfaces with Navy IMSOs to assist in resolving IMS issues or questions
- Conducts Navy unique training to all Navy IMSOs at the Defense Institute for Security Assistance Management (DISAM)
- Provides annual training when hosting the DON IMSO Workshop
- Supports, funds, approves and administers the IMSOs' Field Studies Programs
