

**International Officer Supply Course PIPELINE
(2 MASLs total of 9 weeks)**

**International Officer Supply Course-Resident
(IOSCO-R)**

MASL P152011 ECL 70
Offered 2 times a year (summer and fall)
Duration: 6 weeks
Prerequisites: O-1 to O4 or equivalent
FOLLOW ON COURSE P152003

International Officers only, grade O-1 to O-4, waivers available for civilian and enlisted students. Course designed to familiarize students with the organizational structure of the US Government, US Navy, Navy Supply Systems Command (NAVSUP), Defense Logistics Agency (DLA), and the relationship to the Foreign Military Sales (FMS) process. Discusses Logistics Supply Chain, defined as identifying, locating, ordering and tracking assets. Assists International Customers to develop a process-oriented working knowledge of Department of Defense web-based logistics systems. Included in the course is material identification, catalog systems, FMS requisitioning procedures, all aspects of the Security Cooperation Information Portal (SCIP) and other computer and web-based tools for customer support. Course will provide attendees knowledge of: FEDLOG, WEBFLIS, Asset Visibility of DLA stock on hand, Item Managers notes, requisition status, including detailed shipping information (DSS) - Defense Reutilization Marketing Service (DRMS) for excess DoD stock in disposal. Course also provides a detailed overview of Acquisition Logistics, Allowance Models, Integrated Logistics Support (ILS) and Inventory Control Point (ICP) operations, with a focus on weapons systems support to include study of math models for outfitting and determining allowances quantities. Discusses ship transfer and shipyard procedures, and specific allowance determination for the FMS customer. Course content is flexible, allows for the unique needs of students, and is updated frequently to ensure current changes in systems are included in every class. Students will work with their own country's real time data in order to demonstrate methods used to improve logistics support. Instruction is modeled after training provided to U.S. DoD civilian and military personnel, working in the supply and maintenance communities.

**International Officer Supply Course-Travel
(IOSCO-T)**

MASL P152003 ECL 70
Offered 2 times a year (summer and fall)
Duration: 3 weeks
Prerequisites: O-1 to O4 or equivalent
MUST COMPLETE P152011

Follow on site visits for IOSCO-R to operating sites for additional seminars, briefings, and tours of logistics facilities to reinforce theory and practices learned in IOSCO Resident coursework. Class will travel from Newport to NAVSUP – Foreign Directorate, Philadelphia and NAVSUP-M, Mechanicsburg. Allows students to meet with subject matter experts in Navy FMS cases, Country Program Managers, Security Assistance Field Representatives, and receive briefs on current business practices of NAVSUP-OF concerning FMS support. Briefs and tours conducted by DLA, Susquehanna, NAVSUP Supply Center, Naval Aviation Depot, and various flight line and waterfront supply organizations in the Mechanicsburg/Norfolk/Richmond Areas. Class will conduct Field Studies Program visits to Boston; Bath, Maine; Washington, D.C.; and New York City. Students return to Newport for graduation and departure.

**International Logistics Executive Advanced
Development (ILEAD)**

MASL P171053 ECL 80
Offered 1 time a year
Duration: 7 weeks
Prerequisites: O-5 and above or equivalent

This course is designed to give senior international officers a better understanding of leadership and management challenges faced by logistics leaders. Course includes the 2-week Advanced Management Program (P162015) - listed below - and site visits conducted at Navy commands in the U.S. The course mixes a professional environment with experiences in U.S. lifestyle to foster a personal understanding of the American culture and develop lasting relationships.

Advanced Management Program (AMP)

MASL P162015 ECL 80
Offered 3 – 5 times a year
Duration: 2 weeks
Prerequisites: O-5 and above or equivalent

Equips senior officers with the tools necessary to formulate and implement strategy, develop and manage networks of people, and incorporate experiences into a broadened policy-level perspective. The course is modeled after the executive training programs at civilian universities.

AMP is conducted at the Tench Francis School of Business (on the Navy Supply Corps School campus), and is taught by faculty from the University of Virginia, Darden School of Business. Graduates qualify for post-graduate college credit.

Supply Officer Basic Qualification Course (BQC)
MASL P152010 ECL 70
Duration: 20 weeks

New classes start every three months
Prerequisites: O-1 and above or equivalent

New Supply Corps officers gain a broad range of initial supply skills through a 20-week computer intensive, detail oriented curriculum that includes technical training in supply management, disbursing, retail operations, food service, postal operations, personal computing, leadership and management (divisional and personnel management), shipboard hazardous material, and Maintenance and Material Management (3M).

Division Officer Leadership Course

MASL P162017 ECL 70
Duration: 5 days Req'd follow on after BQC
Prerequisites: O-1 and above or equivalent

Designed to facilitate and indoctrinate all junior officers that will be relieving afloat, in a division officer capacity, the skill sets necessary to be effective first time leaders in an operational environment.

Supply Officer Department Head Course (SODHC)
MASL P152089 ECL 70
Duration: 4 weeks Offered 6 times per year

Prerequisites: Officer O-1 to O-4 or equivalent
Prepares officers to assume the duties of the Supply Department Head on a ship or submarine.

Department Head Leadership Course

MASL P171054 ECL 70
Duration: 5 days Req'd follow on after SODHC
Prerequisites: Officer O-1 to O-4 or equivalent

Indoctrinates all officers afloat to be effective principle assistants and liaisons addressing leadership skills and communication.

**Joint Aviation Supply Maintenance and Material
Management (JASMMM)**

MASL P152088 ECL 70
Duration: 2 weeks Offered 5 times a year

Prerequisites: E-6 to O-4 or civilian equivalent
Includes maintenance and supply, case studies, practical labs, exercises and guest speakers.

Introduction to Expeditionary Logistics

MASL P152030

ECL 70

Duration: 2 weeks

Offered 2 times a year

Prerequisites: E-7 to O-4

Provides an overview of the Joint Planning Process, the Joint and Naval Logistics chain of command, and issues and concerns related to operating in a deployed environment.

Transportation of Hazardous Material (HAZMAT)

MASL P153010

ECL 70

Duration: 2 weeks

Offered 14 times a year

Prerequisites: E-to O-4 or civilian equivalent

Provides mandatory training prerequisite to certify hazardous material for shipment via all modes of transportation. This course is designed only for those personnel who must "certify hazardous materials for shipment." Students are required to furnish a silent, four function, hand held calculator.

MOBILE TRAINING TEAMS

Our staff can develop a 2 to 3 week curriculum to meet country requirements in logistics, contracting, transportation, hazardous materials, fleet, and weapon systems support. NSCS has fielded MTTs to Estonia, Bulgaria, Romania, Croatia, and the Philippines to meet the specific logistics training requirements. Contact the school through NETSAFA for specific requirements.

NAVSUP Pub P-526 (MASL P304013)

This course provides supply personnel with information on the NAVSUP Publication 526 – FMS Customer Supply System Guide. This MTT is recommended for supply personnel who requisition material under Navy Cases.

MILSTRIP (MASL P304028)

This MTT is a course on Military Standard Requisition and Issue Procedures (MILSTRIP) designed for FMS customers. The course includes submission of requisitions, cancellations, modifications, and follow-ups; practical exercises with use of DAMES/STARR-PC systems; transmission of MILSTRIP transactions; and interpretation of supply and shipment status and other MILSTRIP data in order to effectively track and manage requisitions.

Navy Supply Corps School International Training

The Navy Supply Corps School (NSCS) in Newport, Rhode Island is the Navy's premier logistics training command, and offers some of the U.S. Navy's finest international training programs. Our staff is dedicated to maximizing the educational and cultural experience of our international students.

International officers have been taught at NSCS for the last fifty-nine years and more than 2500 international officers have added our various logistics and transportation courses to their resumes. While some 70 – 90 international students each year attend courses at the Navy Supply Corps School, about 30 officers each year attend the 9-week International Officers Supply Course (IOSCO) Pipeline.

In addition to the resident courses offered at the school, Mobile Training Teams (MTT) can provide 'shelf' courses to international students in their home country. NSCS can also provide MTTs that tailor courses of instruction designed to meet the specific needs of a country, targeted to their individual students' work environments.

A secondary goal of our training program is to help international students gain a better understanding of our country, its beliefs, and the people that make it unique. To do this we offer Field Studies Program opportunities that demonstrate the principles of human rights and democratic principles.
